

What REFORMA has been up to!

On June 28, 2023, my first official REFORMA President business was to endorse, on behalf of REFORMA and the Executive Board, a statement released from <u>Unite Against Book Bans American Library Association Freedom to Read Foundation</u>. 70 years after the initial statement was drafted and released by ALA, REFORMA recommits to the freedom to read is essential to our democracy and the birthright of all regardless of beliefs or political persuasion.



In September 2023, the REFORMA National Conference Coordinating Committee (RNCCC) along with the REFORMA National Conference (RNC) steering committee conducted site visits in Long Beach, California to select the next host hotel for RNCVIII, which will take place in Long Beach in Fall 2025. 




On September 19, 2023, I had the great privilege of speaking on a panel alongside past REFORMA President, Isabel Espinal, and Elisa Garcia for the Hispanic Heritage Month Symposium at San Jose State University. The conversation, entitled Latinos: Contributing to the Fabric of the Nation, was an impassioned dialogue with participants. It began with a keynote address by Loida Garcia-Febo, international library consultant and SJSU Health and Wellness Ambassador.

As a proud son of Mexican immigrants, it was an honor to provide an introduction to this program.
